

SUMMIT FIRE & EMS

ISO Public Protection Classification Effective December 01, 2022 September 20, 2022

Summit Fire & EMS (SFE) has an ISO Public Protection Classification of 02/2x for most residential and commercial areas. These classifications were set by the Insurance Services Office (ISO) after a comprehensive evaluation of SFE.

Municipalities and county subdivisions that are within 5 road miles from one of our fire stations and are within 1,000 feet of an approved fire hydrant or alternate water source such as Frisco, Dillon, Silverthorne, Copper Mtn., Keystone, Wildernest, Dillon Valley, Summit Cove, Keystone Ranch, Mesa Cortina, Summerwood, Ruby Ranch and Willowbrook have a **Class 2** rating.

If a property is within 5 road miles from a fire station, but greater than 1,000 feet from an approved fire hydrant or alternate water source, such as portions of the Ptarmigan or Bill's Ranch, they will receive a **Class 2X** rating.

If a property is greater than 5 road miles from a fire station but has an approved fire hydrant or alternate water source within 1,000 feet, such as Montezuma, Parts of Eagles Nest, Three Peaks, Summit Sky Ranch, Acorn Creek, and Pebble Creek subdivisions, they will receive a **Class 10W** rating.

Any areas greater than 5 road miles from a station and that do not have an approved alternate water source will have a **Class 10** rating.
